CPCCLDG3001A LICENCE TO PERFORM DOGGING

This three day course has been designed to provide the knowledge to safely and efficiently sling and direct loads handled by cranes. A Dogging High Risk Work Licence is required in all industries when a person must make a decision on what type of slinging technique or lifting equipment is required, or how to sling a load that is freely suspended by any type of crane. Note: The relevant High Risk Work Licence unit of competence will be implemented upon conclusion of the Safe Work Australia review.

OBJECTIVE

To train and assess participants for the knowledge and skills required for assessment for the Perform Dogging High Risk Licence and to meet the requirements of 'CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging'.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

As a result of this program participants will be able to:

- Take precautions and measures to prevent accidents in connection with the movements of loads handled by a crane
- Safely and efficiently sling and handle loads
- State the safe working load of, and uses for, ropes, chains and other lifting devices
- Estimate the weights of loads composed of different materials
- Direct the movement of cranes using standard crane signals, both visual and audible

PRE-REQUISITE

Course participants must be 18 years of age, and be able to read and understand the english language.
